It will equip participants to work safely and effectively even with limited time and no clinical supervision. This 7 day bespoke course spread over 7 months, combines social work and clinical psychology, and will provide participants with information, practical strategies and tools that can support families with:

- Relational and developmental trauma
- Emotional regulation
- Rejecting behaviours
- Adolescence
- Aggressive and controlling behaviour
- Sexualised behaviour
- Stretching the truth and taking items
- Life story work

Karen has previously worked in both Milton Keynes's and Kensington and Chelsea's Looked after Children (LAC) and fostering services, and within the National Implementation Service for evidence-based interventions for Looked after children, children on the edge of care, and children in custody at the Michael Rutter Centre in the Maudsley Hospital.

Karen is also a member of the CoramBAAF health group advisory committee, and a reviewer for the Journal of Adoption and Fostering.
