4. To be confident writing mind-minded narratives and helping others to develop these.
5. To be confident responding with PACE, PACE role plays and helping others to develop the use of PACE

Professionals who work with developmentally traumatised children and their families for example social workers and therapists.

### **Applicant Requirements**

Delegates should have completed DDP level 1 and 2 and have at least 5 years experience in supporting families caring for children who have experienced developmental trauma.
