



# Foetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD)

### **About FASD:**

Foetal alcohol syndrome (FAS) and Foetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) describes the range of disorders caused by prenatal alcohol exposure to the developing foetus. Research suggests that more than 7000 babies are born every year in the UK with FASD. Some local authorities estimate that around 70% of the children needing adoptive families have drug/alcohol misuse in their background or have been exposed during pregnancy. Prenatal exposure to alcohol can have a significant impact on areas of cognition, language, behaviour, social skills, attention and the sensory system.

### **About the course:**

This course will cover the following areas:

- Identify the causes and long term effects of FASD
- Explain the difference between FAS (Foetal Alcohol Syndrome) and FASD
- Identify the behaviours and needs of someone with FASD throughout their different life stages
- Understand how to get a diagnosis
- Understand how those affected can best be supported and identify strategies to achieve this.
